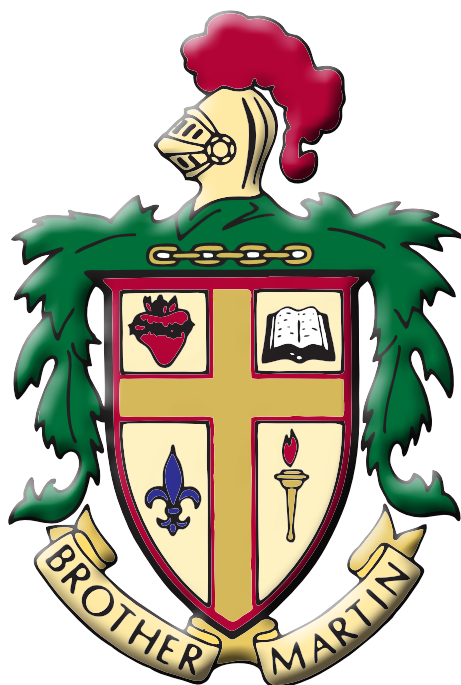

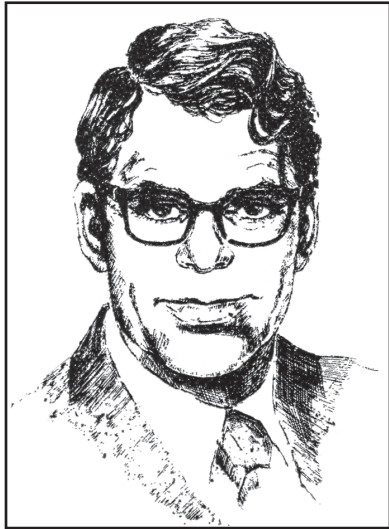

**BROTHER MORE SCHAEFER, S.C.  
1932-1983**



A NATIVE OF NEW ORLEANS, BROTHER MORE GRADUATED FROM ST. ALOYSIUS IN 1950 AND PRONOUNCED HIS FIRST VOWS AS A BROTHER OF THE SACRED HEART IN 1952.

HE EARNED A B.S. DEGREE IN PHYSICS AND MATHEMATICS FROM SPRING HILL COLLEGE, AN M.A. IN GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA AND AN M.S. IN PHYSICS FROM PURDUE UNIVERSITY.

BROTHER MORE SERVED IN MANY WAYS. HE WAS A TEACHER, A COACH, DEPARTMENT CHAIRMAN, GUIDANCE COUNSELOR, DIRECTOR OF ADMISSIONS AND VICE PRINCIPAL.

AT THE TIME OF HIS DEATH IN 1983 HE HAD LONG BEEN RECOGNIZED AS A MASTER EDUCATOR. ONE OF THE COMMENTS MADE AT THAT TIME SUMS UP THE REPUTATION THAT BROTHER MORE EARNED.

IN WHATEVER PLACE AND IN WHATEVER POSITION  
HE SERVED, HE WAS ALWAYS THOROUGH,  
PROFESSIONAL, CHALLENGING AND CONCERNED.  
IN A WORD, HE LOVED.

**THE BROTHER MORE SCHAEFER FACULTY AWARD**

**ELIGIBILITY**

THE RECIPIENT MUST BE A FULL-TIME MEMBER OF THE FACULTY. THE RECIPIENT'S ENTIRE DAY MUST BE SPENT IN PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY FOR THE SCHOOL. THE RECIPIENT MUST HAVE BEEN ON THE FACULTY FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS AND NOT RECEIVED THE AWARD WITHIN THE LAST FIVE YEARS.

**CRITERIA**

**EXCELLENCE IN INSTRUCTION**

BOTH THE *RULE OF LIFE* AND *EDUCATIONAL MISSION AND MINISTRY* GIVE CONSIDERABLE ATTENTION TO TEACHING METHODS, CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT AND OTHER PEDAGOGICAL MATTERS WHICH HAVE LONG BEEN THE LION'S SHARE OF OUR MISSION. INSTRUCTION IS SO IMPORTANT TO US BECAUSE WE BELIEVE THAT THROUGH THE CHRISTIAN TEACHER'S CONCERN, CHRIST IS MADE PRESENT TO STUDENTS (*EDUCATIONAL MISSION & MINISTRY #152*).

IN EVERY COURSE, ATTENTION IS GIVEN TO THE EXAMINATION OF GOSPEL VALUES.

INSTRUCTION AS A COMPONENT OF EDUCATION IS WHAT MAKES US SOUGHT AFTER BY OUR CULTURE. THROUGH OUR INSTRUCTIONAL COMPETENCY, WE ISSUE CHRIST'S CALL, "COME TO ME."

**COMMITMENT TO STUDENT FORMATION**

THE *RULE OF LIFE* SAYS THAT "IT IS NOT SUFFICIENT JUST TO INSTRUCT. WE MUST GIVE A FORMATION WHICH ENABLES THE YOUNG TO IMPROVE SOCIETY BY FURTHERING THE REIGN OF CHRIST" (*RULE OF LIFE #153*). EDUCATION GOES BEYOND INSTRUCTION IN THE SHAPING OF THE YOUNG PERSON'S LIFE.

THROUGH DISCIPLINE AND ORDER, THROUGH EXPERIENCE OF WORSHIP AND OF SOCIAL INTERACTION, WE FORM BEHAVIORS AND ATTITUDES OF YOUNG PEOPLE ACCORDING TO THE VALUES OF THE GOSPEL.

INSTRUCTION OPENS TO THE YOUNG THE GIFT OF LEARNING. FORMATION CONFRONTS THEM WITH THEIR LIMITS. WE ALWAYS TAKE THE ROLE OF JOHN THE BAPTIST, POINTING TO JESUS CHRIST AS THEIR MODEL. GROWING IN WISDOM, AGE AND GRACE BEFORE GOD AND NEIGHBOR.

**DEMONSTRATION OF CHRISTIAN WITNESS**

EXPERIENCE HAS SHOWN THAT THE MOST EFFECTIVE EVANGELIZING FORCE IS THE EXAMPLE OF OUR LIVES. WHAT MOST EDUCATES IS WHAT STUDENTS PERCEIVE TO BE OUR VALUES. THE QUALITY OF OUR RELATIONSHIPS, PARTICULARLY WITH THEM, THE VALUES WE DISPLAY IN OUR ACTIONS, SPEAK MORE FORCEFULLY THAN OUR INSTRUCTION OR OUR ATTEMPTS TO FORM BEHAVIORS.

TO EVANGELIZE THROUGH EDUCATION MEANS THAT STUDENTS MUST SOMEHOW SEE SOMETHING WHICH WE OFTEN CONSIDER VERY PRIVATE – OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD. WE, THEREFORE, PRAY WITH THEM, WORSHIP WITH THEM, EXPRESS OUR FAITH IN THEIR PRESENCE AND PROVIDE THE EXAMPLE OF A CHRISTIAN LIFESTYLE.
