SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS/RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION

Brother Martin High School is a Roman Catholic, private, college-preparatory, boys high school owned and operated by the Brothers of the Sacred Heart. The school began in 1969 as a consolidation of St. Aloysius High School (1869) and Cor Jesu High School (1954), both of which were Brothers of the Sacred Heart schools. The average class size is 25 students. The current enrollment of grades 8-12 consists of 1100 students. Brother Martin students come from every section of the metropolitan area. The senior class of 2020 numbers 210.

ACCREDITATION

Brother Martin High School is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. It operates in full compliance and with approval of Louisiana's State Department of Education and the New Orleans Archdiocesan Office of Catholic Schools. It is also recognized by the U.S. Department of Education as an Exemplary School.

ADMISSION POLICY

Brother Martin High School admits students of any race, color, religion, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in the administration of its admissions policies, scholarship/financial aid program, athletic program or other school-administered programs. Admissions is selective and based on the following considerations: (1) a strong desire to attend Brother Martin, (2) overall elementary school record, (3) recommendation of elementary school principal and teachers, and (4) an interview with each applicant and his parents.

GRADING POLICY

Grades are issued four times a year for each nine-week quarter. Semester grades are based on the average of two quarters. Grades are determined and recorded by the letter classification system: A, B, C, D, and F. **The cumulative grade point average is determined by semester grades.** All courses for which credit may be earned are included in the GPA calculation, except for courses which have a grade of "P". Honors AP and Honors courses are weighted with an extra quality point in the GPA calculation. Students failing a class are required to attend Summer Credit Recovery. The grade earned during Credit Recovery was averaged with the failing quarter grade and does not appear separately on the transcript. A student's rank is determined by the relationship of his weighted cumulative GPA to the weighted cumulative GPA of his classmates.

SERVICE COMMITMENT

Brother Martin High School's service program is designed to complement the religion curriculum as it attends to the faith development of students. Eighth graders and freshmen are required to complete ten hours of service; sophomores are required to complete twenty hours. In the junior year, a major service project correlates with the study of social justice. Juniors are required to complete sixty hours of service to the community at area agencies and spend time in reflection and journaling on their experience. Seniors are required to complete twenty hours of service. Many students complete more service hours than those required by Brother Martin High School.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Brother Martin High School provides leadership opportunities in over 60 co-curricular, extracurricular, and athletic activities in an effort to promote educational and social opportunities that will enable the student to realize his talents and interests and to learn how to live, work, and share with others. These activities not only add to the enjoyment of school life but also permit the student to develop broader insights and experiences in the academic, cultural, political, social, and athletic areas.

AP COURSES OFFERED

Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, Physics 1, Physics 2, Statistics, United States History, United States Government and Politics, Comparative Government and Politics, Art History AP, Psychology AP

Students may enroll in AP courses only by invitation of the faculty. All Brother Martin students enrolled in AP courses are expected to sit for the exams.
