HONOR CHOIRS CHAIR

Dr. Lauren Ramey is the Associate Director of Choral Activities and Director of Music Education at East Tennessee State University where she conducts the BucsWorth Tenor Bass Choir. She also teaches courses in choral conducting and music education.



Currently, Dr. Ramey also serves on the Tennessee Music Educators Association Board as the Higher Education Chair and on the Tennessee ACDA Board as the Tenor Bass Repertoire and Resources Chair.

Prior to her appointment at ETSU, Dr. Ramey served as assistant conductor for the Florida State University Chamber Choir, the graduate-level choral ensemble. She was also the assistant conductor for the FSU University Singers, Levana (SSAA), Choral Union, and the Tallahassee Community Chorus. Additionally, Dr. Ramey worked with undergraduate and graduate choral conducting courses.

Before her doctoral studies, Dr. Ramey was the Director of Choirs and AP Music Theory at Ravenwood High School (Brentwood, Tennessee). Under her direction, the Ravenwood Choirs performed at the 2019 Music For All National Concert Festival and the 2017 and 2019 Tennessee Music Educators Association Conferences. During her public-school teaching tenure, Ramey was a recipient of the CMA Music Teacher of Excellence Award and was a quarterfinalist for the Grammy Music Educator Award. In addition to teaching at Ravenwood, Dr. Ramey was served as the assistant conductor of the Nashville Symphony Chorus.

Dr. Ramey is originally from Dayton, Ohio, and attended the Blair School of Music at Vanderbilt University where she received her Bachelor of Music degree in Choral Music Education/Piano Performance and a Master of Education (Choral) degree. In 2022, Dr. Ramey earned a Ph.D. in Music Education/Choral Conducting from Florida State University.

Guest Conductor



Dr. Andrea Ramsey enjoys an international presence as a composer, conductor, scholar, and music educator. Her teaching experiences range from work with adolescent and children's voices to high school and collegiate voices. She enjoys regular opportunities to conduct all-state and divisional level honor choirs, festival events at Carnegie Hall, and served as a principal conductor for the Pacific International Young Women's Choral Festival in Eugene, Oregon and conducted the National ACDA Junior High/Middle School Honor Choir in 2023. Before leaping into full time composing and guest conducting, Andrea held positions in music education and conducting at The Ohio State University and the University of Colorado, respectively. An ASCAP Plus award-winning composer, Andrea believes strongly in the creation of new works. Her compositions are available with traditional publishers and also through MusicSpoke, a digital sheetmusic marketplace. She enjoys residency collaborations with ensembles and festival choirs, some of which have included: the University of Oregon, the Allegro Choirs of Kansas City, and the Crescent City Choral Festival in New Orleans. As a scholar, she has presented for state, divisional, and national conventions of the American Choral Directors Association, the 6th Annual Symposium on Sociology in Music Education, as well as The Phenomenon Singing Symposium in St. Johns, Newfoundland, Canada. She has co-authored articles published in the Choral Journal, as well as the Journal of Research in Music Education. A native of Arkansas, she has experienced in her own life the power of music to provide a sense of community, better understanding of our humanity, and rich opportunities for self-discovery.

Collaborative Pianist



Kevin Caparotta is the Choral Director and Educational Technology Specialist at Brother Martin High School in New Orleans. In addition to teaching and conducting, Mr. Caparotta is active as a pianist, singer, composer, and adjudicator. He has composed or arranged music for Walt Disney World, the National World War II Museum, the New Orleans Children's Chorus, and the Justice Choir Songbook, and his music has been published by Boosey & Hawkes. Mr. Caparotta also has extensive musical theatre experience, having served as musical director, conductor, and/or pianist for numerous productions. He frequently plays keyboards in the pits of touring musicals such as Wicked and The Book of Mormon, and he was a vacation sub for three years on the national tour of Jersey Boys. Mr. Caparotta is a past president of the Louisiana chapter of ACDA. He is a graduate of Loyola University and Northwestern State University.

Catie Hitzgrath is currently pursuing a Masters of Education in Education Leadership at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. She currently works under the Office of Academic Affairs at the University of Miami, and her goal is to collaborate with nonprofit arts organizations to optimize resources and offer students equitable access to career and college readiness opportunities. Catie spent 12 years as a middle and high school choral director in North Carolina and earned a Bachelor of Music in music education from Meredith College as well as Master of Music in music education from Appalachian State University. In addition to teaching public school she has spent many years involved with children's choirs across North Carolina, and is the founder of the NCACDA MiddleFest!, a choral festival for middle school singers across North Carolina. She is an active member of the American Choral Directors Association and has worked as a member of the Southern Region ACDA conference planning team since 2019.



Andrew Revels, a North Carolina native, has been working with choirs of all ages for nearly a decade. After receiving his Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Campbell University in Buies Creek, NC, he taught middle school choir for 6 years in the Wake County Public School System where he also served as the All-County Chorus Coordinator. He currently serves on the Middle School Choral Executive Board of the North Carolina Music Educators' Association, is the assistant director of the Fuquay-Varina Chorale, the artistic director of the Peak City Singers of Apex, and the music and worship leader at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church in Fuquay-Varina, NC. Andrew also serves as an adjudicator and clinician in the triangle area of North Carolina, where he resides with his wife and two daughters.

Guest Conductor



Dr. Derrick Fox is Professor of Choral Music and Associate Dean of Graduate Studies and Creative Endeavors at Michigan State University. Prior to MSU, he was the Director of Choral Activities and Distinguished Professor of Music at the University of Nebraska–Omaha and Assistant Professor of Choral Music at Ithaca College. Dr. Fox has taught at the middle school, high school and collegiate levels. His conducting experiences have included singers from upper elementary choirs through collegiate and community choirs. He was awarded the 2021 Bryan R. Johnson Service Award by the Nebraska Music Educators Association and the 2022 University of Nebraska Omaha Award for Distinguished Research/Creative Activity.

Dr. Fox has conducted all state and regional choirs across the United States, led international, national and regional choral concerts/residencies and presented professional development workshops across the United States and internationally. His professional workshops focus on assessment in the choral classroom, building classroom community, rehearsal strategies, choral conducting techniques and shape note singing in the African American community.

Collaborative Pianist



Admired for her consummate skill and for her “musical excellence which is overshadowed only by her generous spirit and kindness to her colleagues” (Thomas Wilkins, Hollywood Bowl Orchestra, Boston Symphony and Omaha Symphony), pianist **Stacie Haneline** maintains an active career teaching and performing. Career highlights include collaborating with Dr. Derrick Fox at the University of Nebraska Omaha and throughout the choral world for seven years. Performance highlights include the world premiere of Shawn Okpebholo’s, Words Like Freedom with soprano, Jamie Reimer; Rosephanye Powell’s, Hold Fast to Dreams with soprano Lisa Burr and violinist Naimi Burr; and Andre Myers, Surviving the Apocalypse with soprano, Jamie Reimer and baritone, Byron Jones during the 25th African American Art Song Alliance. Stacie is the Coordinator of the Collaborative Area and Collaborative Pianist at the University of Nebraska Omaha, as well as the pianist for the Nebraska Festival Singers under the direction of Dr. Marques Garrett.

Guest Conductor



Praised by the Miami Herald for their “impressive maturity and striking melodic distinction”, **Sydney Guillaume’s** compositions are known to be intricate, challenging and yet highly spirited. They promote human values and are full of heart and passion. Many of his choral works, most with original poetry by his father Gabriel T. Guillaume, have fostered an awareness of the beautiful Haitian culture and continue to serve as an ambassador for his native country. In 2016, he was inducted into the 1804 List of Haitian-American Change Makers, a prestigious list named in honor of Haiti’s year of independence that “recognizes Haitian-Americans in the United States who have demonstrated outstanding achievement and success in their profession and proven themselves to be forces for change in their communities.” In 2017, he was honored by the top music school in Haiti for his “great contribution in the expansion and the promotion of the music and culture of Haiti around the world.”

Sydney Guillaume graduated from the University of Miami in 2004, where his works were performed by the Miami University Chorale conducted by Dr. Jo-Michael Scheibe. Originally from Port-au-Prince, Haiti, he currently resides in Portland, Oregon, where he frequently workshops his music with university and high school choirs throughout North America.

Collaborative Pianist



Dr. Edward Rothmel has worked extensively as a pianist, coach, and conductor throughout the United States and abroad. A frequent vocal coach to students, Dr. Rothmel strives to guide them in developing their independent musicianship while fostering stylistically appropriate interpretation throughout their careers. In preparation for the premiere of Letters from Georgia by Kevin Puts, Edward served as rehearsal pianist and coach to Renée Fleming. Previously, he has served on the faculty of University of Northern Colorado, Boston University Tanglewood Institute, and Si Parla, Si Canta in Urbana, Italy. Other appointments include Vocal Coach at Mo. Lorin Maazel’s Castleton Festival, Assistant Conductor and ongoing private coaching studio in Arlington, VA. Dr. Rothmel’s students have gone on to many of the nation’s most prestigious programs such as the Lindemann Young Artist Program and the Merola Opera Program. As a collaborative pianist, Dr. Rothmel has appeared in recital at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall with tenor Albert Lee, and as a guest at institutions such as Pennsylvania State University and University of North Texas. Eddie received his DMA in Piano Accompanying and Chamber Music, with a Minor in Vocal Coaching from the Eastman School of Music where he studied with Dr. Jean Barr and was the recipient of the 2019 Jean Barr Award. He is also a graduate of Florida State University’s College of Music, where he earned both his BM and MM in Piano Performance.

Honor Choir Managers



Rose Hellmers, a 2023 CMA Music Teacher of Excellence, is the Director of Choirs at Ravenwood High School, where she conducts four choirs that consistently receive the highest scores at district, state, and national competitions. This year, they are performing at the 2024 TnMEA Conference. In the past 3 years, she has over-doubled the size of the choir program. She serves as the district PLC Team Lead, the school’s Tri-M advisor, and teaches AP Music Theory, with a 100% exam pass rate. Hellmers serves as Music Director for Ravenwood’s musicals, winning Spotlight awards for Best Vocals and Orchestra. Hellmers serves as Assistant Conductor of the Nashville Symphony Chorus, where she has prepared many major works, several recording projects, and Burnett’s Bluegrass Mass, which she conducted at TnACDA. Previously, Hellmers was Director of Choirs at Portage Northern MS/HS (selected to conduct at MI-ACDA) and the founding Strings Director at Nashville K-8 Harding Academy. She serves on the state TnACDA board, has had 5 student teachers, presented at numerous conferences, and conducted at national masterclasses throughout the country. Hellmers received a full scholarship for her Masters in Music Education and Bachelor of Music from Vanderbilt University.



Cassidy Van Amburg is a Chicago native who has been teaching high school Choir in Nashville for the last 6 years. Cassidy moved to Nashville in 2014 to attend Vanderbilt University, where she studied Secondary Education and English with a minor in Voice. After graduating, Cassidy started teaching at Nolensville High School, where she built the Choir program from 1 choir of 30 students to 3 choirs with 90 total students. She also serves as Vocal Director and Choreographer for the school musicals. When she’s not at Nolensville, Cassidy teaches voice lessons at Roots Academy and sings in the Nashville Symphony Chorus.
